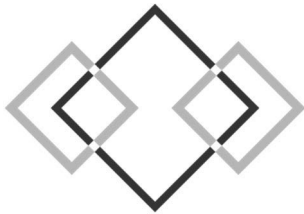

Explanatory Statement

This Explanatory Statement has been prepared to provide information which the Directors believe to be material to Shareholders in deciding whether or not to pass the Resolutions.

1. Background – Placement, JLM Mandate, and JLM Options

On 3 August 2026, the Company announced that it had received firm commitments for a placement of 425,000,000 Shares at \$0.004 per Share to raise up to approximately \$1.7 million (before costs) (**Placement**). Each share subscribed for will, subject to Shareholder approval, carry one free attaching option for every one share subscribed for, exercisable at \$0.008 on or before 31 December 2028 (**Attaching Options**).

The Placement is being undertaken in two tranches. The first tranche comprised an aggregate of 216,473,416 Shares (**Tranche 1**), of which 186,638,416 Shares were issued on 11 August 2026 and 29,835,000 Shares were issued on 17 August 2026, using the Company's placement capacity under Listing Rule 7.1. The second tranche of 208,526,584 Shares (**Tranche 2**) is proposed to be issued subject to obtaining Shareholder approval under Resolution 2.

GBA Capital Pty Ltd (**GBA**), Max Capital Pty Ltd (**Max**) and Peak Asset Management Limited (**Peak**) were engaged as joint lead managers to the Placement pursuant to a mandate (**JLM Mandate**). The Company has agreed to pay the JLMs (or their nominee(s)) the following remuneration:

- (a) **JLM Options:** subject to Shareholder approval, 63,750,000 Options on the terms and conditions set out in Schedule 1; and
- (b) **Placing Fees:** 6% (plus GST) of the amount raised under the Placement (total of \$102,000 excluding GST).

The engagement of the JLMs is otherwise on customary terms and conditions.

Tranche 1 of the Placement was completed in two issues, with 186,638,416 Shares issued on 11 August 2026 and 29,835,000 Shares issued on 17 August 2026, and Shareholder approval to ratify these issues is the subject of Resolution 1 (in relation to the Shares issued using the capacity under Listing Rule 7.1).

Approval of the issue of Shares under Tranche 2 of the Placement is the subject of Resolution 2.

Approval of the issue of the Attaching Options is the subject of Resolution 3.

The issue of the JLM Options to the JLMs (or their nominee(s)) under the JLM Mandate is the subject of Resolution 4.

2. Resolutions 1 – Ratification of Shares – Tranche 1 of the Placement – Listing Rule 7.1

2.1 General

Details of the Placement are set out in Section 1.

Resolution 1 seeks Shareholder approval to ratify the issue of the Shares issued under Tranche 1 of the Placement.

The Chair intends to exercise all available undirected proxies in favour of Resolution 1.

2.2 ASX Listing Rule 7.1

ASX Listing Rule 7.1 provides that a company must not, subject to specified exceptions, issue or agree to issue more equity securities during any 12-month period than that amount which represents 15% of the number of fully paid ordinary securities on issue at the commencement of that 12 month period (**Placement Capacity**).

2.3 ASX Listing Rule 7.4

ASX Listing Rule 7.4 sets out an exception to ASX Listing Rule 7.1. It provides that where a company in general meeting ratifies the previous issue of securities made pursuant to ASX Listing Rule 7.1 (and provided that the previous issue did not breach ASX Listing Rule 7.1) those securities will be deemed to have been made with shareholder approval for the purpose of ASX Listing Rule 7.1.

2.4 Effect of the Resolution

The issue of the Shares in the Placement did not fit within any of the exceptions from ASX Listing Rule 7.1 and was not subject to prior Shareholder approval. The issue of the Shares the subject of Resolution 1 effectively used up most of the available Placement Capacity under ASX Listing Rule 7.1, reducing the Company's capacity to issue further equity securities without Shareholder approval under Listing Rule 7.1 for the 12-month period following the date of their issue. At the time of issue, sufficient placement capacity was available that the issue of the securities the subject of Resolution 1 did not breach ASX Listing Rule 7.1.

If Resolution 1 is passed, the Company will retain the flexibility to issue equity securities in the future up to the Placement Capacity set out in ASX Listing Rule 7.1 without the requirement to obtain prior Shareholder approval. The base figure (referred to as variable "A" in the formulae in ASX Listing Rules 7.A), from which the Company's Placement Capacity is calculated, will be a higher number, which in turn will allow a proportionately higher number of securities to be issued without prior Shareholder approval.

If Resolution 1 is not passed, then the Company's Placement Capacity under ASX Listing Rule 7.1 will not be refreshed; the result being that the Shares the subject of Resolution 1 will continue to be included in calculating the Company's use of the 15% limit under ASX Listing Rule 7.1, effectively decreasing the number of equity securities the Company can issue without prior Shareholder approval over the 12 month period following the date of their issue.

2.5 Board Recommendation

The Directors recommend that Shareholders vote in favour of Resolution 1.

2.6 Technical information required by ASX Listing Rule 7.5

Pursuant to and in accordance with ASX Listing Rule 7.5, the following information is provided in relation to Resolutions 1:

- (a) the Shares were issued to sophisticated and professional investors introduced by the JLMs, the allottees being determined in consultation with the Directors. None of the subscribers were a related party of the Company or an associate of any of them, or a party to whom an issue of equity securities requires Shareholder approval under ASX Listing Rule 10.11. None of the allottees was a person whose identity would be deemed to be material in terms of the criteria in ASX Listing Rules Guidance Note 21 (being members of Key Management Personnel, Company advisers, substantial shareholders, or associates of any of these parties, who were issued a number of shares equal to or greater than 1% of the Company's issued capital at the time);

- (b) the Company issued 216,473,416 Shares using its Placement Capacity under Listing Rule 7.1;
- (c) the Shares issued were all fully paid ordinary shares in the capital of the Company and rank equally in all respects with the Company's existing Shares;
- (d) the Shares were issued on 11 and 17 August 2026;
- (e) the Shares were issued at an issue price of \$0.004 each;
- (f) the Company received \$865,893 (before costs) from the issue of the Shares, which it is applying towards:
 - (i) the drilling program at the Cabin Lake gold project;
 - (ii) ongoing geological and geophysical interpretation and follow-up target refinement;
 - (iii) general working capital; and
 - (iv) costs of the offer.
- (g) the Shares were issued pursuant to customary placement agreements between the Company and participants in the Placement. The material terms of the Placement are summarised in Section 1; and
- (h) a voting exclusion statement is included in the Notice for Resolution 1.

3. Resolution 2 – Issue of Shares - Tranche 2 of the Placement

3.1 General

Details of the Placement are set out in Section 1.

Resolution 2 seeks Shareholder approval to issue Shares under Tranche 2 of the Placement.

The Chair intends to exercise all available undirected proxies in favour of Resolution 2.

3.2 ASX Listing Rule 7.1

A summary of ASX Listing Rule 7.1 is set out in Section 2.2.

3.3 Effect of the Resolution

The issue of the Shares does not fit within any of the exceptions from ASX Listing Rule 7.1 and is conditional upon Shareholder approval (which is being sought pursuant to Resolution 2).

If Resolution 2 is passed, the Company will be able to proceed with the issue of 208,526,584 Shares at any time during the period of 3 months after the Meeting (or such later date to the extent permitted by any ASX waiver or modification of the ASX Listing Rules) without using up any part of the Company's Placement Capacity under ASX Listing Rule 7.1.

If Resolution 2 is not passed, the Company will not be able to proceed with the issue of Shares contemplated by Tranche 2 of the Placement and will not receive approximately \$834,107 in subscription funds.

3.4 Directors' recommendation

The Directors recommend that Shareholders vote in favour of Resolution 2.

3.5 Technical information required by ASX Listing Rule 7.3

Pursuant to and in accordance with ASX Listing Rule 7.3, the following information is provided in relation to Resolution 2:

- (a) the Shares will be issued to sophisticated and professional investors introduced by the JLMs, the allottees being determined in consultation with the Directors. No Shares in Tranche 2 of the Placement will be issued to a related party of the Company or an associate of any of them, or a party to whom an issue of equity securities requires Shareholder approval under ASX Listing Rule 10.11. Further, none of the allottees will be a person whose identity would be deemed to be material in terms of the criteria in ASX Listing Rules Guidance Note 21 (being members of Key Management Personnel, Company advisers, substantial shareholders, or associates of any of these parties, who were issued a number of shares equal to or greater than 1% of the Company's issued capital at the time);
- (b) the maximum number of Shares that the Company may issue under Resolution 2 is 208,526,584 Shares;
- (c) the Shares will be issued as fully paid ordinary shares in the capital of the Company and rank equally in all respects with the Company's existing Shares;
- (d) the Shares will be issued no later than 3 months after the date of the Meeting (or such later date to the extent permitted by any ASX waiver or modification of the ASX Listing Rules);
- (e) the Shares will be issued at an issue price of \$0.004 each;
- (f) a total of \$834,107 (before costs) will be raised by the issue of these Shares;
- (g) the funds raised will form part of the total amount of funds raised by the Placement, which will be used as described in Section 2.6(f);
- (h) the Shares will be issued pursuant to customary placement agreements between the Company and participants in the Placement. The material terms of the Placement is summarised at Section 1; and
- (i) a voting exclusion statement is included in the Notice for Resolution 2.

4. Resolution 3 – Issue of Attaching Options – Placement

4.1 General

Resolution 3 seeks Shareholder approval to issue Attaching Options to the subscribers of Shares under the Placement on the basis of one (1) Attaching Option for each Share subscribed. The Attaching Options will be issued at no cost to the subscriber and will be exercisable at \$0.008 per Share on or before 31 December 2028.

The Attaching Options will be offered to subscribers under the Placement pursuant to a prospectus to be issued by the Company in due course. Subject to meeting the spread requirements under the Listing Rules, the Company will seek quotation of the Attaching Options on ASX. The full terms of the Attaching Options are set out in Schedule 1.

The Chair intends to exercise all available undirected proxies in favour of Resolution 3.

4.2 ASX Listing Rule 7.1

A summary of ASX Listing Rule 7.1 is set out in Section 2.2.

4.3 Effect of the Resolution

The issue of the Attaching Options does not fit within any of the exceptions from ASX Listing Rule 7.1 and is conditional upon Shareholder approval (which is being sought pursuant to Resolution 3).

If Resolution 3 is passed, then the Company will be able to proceed with the issue of Attaching Options to the subscribers at any time during the period of 3 months after the Meeting (or a longer period, if allowed by ASX), without using up any part of the Company's Placement Capacity under ASX Listing Rule 7.1.

If Resolution 3 is not passed, the Company will not be able to proceed with the issue of the Attaching Options and may need to agree alternative form of compensation to the subscribers, for example, cash payments based on an independent option valuation.

4.4 Directors' recommendation

The Directors recommend that Shareholders vote in favour of Resolution 3.

4.5 Technical information required by ASX Listing Rule 7.3

Pursuant to and in accordance with ASX Listing Rule 7.3, the following information is provided in relation to Resolution 3:

- (a) the Attaching Options will be issued to the subscribers under the Placement;
- (b) the maximum number of Attaching Options to be issued is 425,000,000 Options;
- (c) the Attaching Options have an exercise price of \$0.008 each and will expire on or before 31 December 2028. The Attaching Options will be issued on the terms and conditions set out in Schedule 1;
- (d) the Attaching Options will be issued no later than 3 months after the date of the Meeting (or such later date to the extent permitted by any ASX waiver or modification of the ASX Listing Rules) and it is intended that issue of all the Options will occur on the same date;
- (e) the Attaching Options are free-attaching Options and are being issued for nil consideration;
- (f) the purpose of the issue of the Attaching Options is as part of the Placement terms; and
- (g) a voting exclusion statement is included in the Notice for Resolution 3.

5. Resolution 4 – Issue of JLM Options – JLMs

5.1 General

Resolution 4 seeks Shareholder approval to issue JLMs Options to the JLMs (or their nominee(s)) as part consideration for their engagement as JLMs of the Placement.

Details of the Lead Manager Mandate are set out in Section 1.

The Chair intends to exercise all available undirected proxies in favour of Resolution 4.

5.2 ASX Listing Rule 7.1

A summary of ASX Listing Rule 7.1 is set out in Section 2.2.

5.3 Effect of the Resolution

The issue of the JLM Options does not fit within any of the exceptions from ASX Listing Rule 7.1 and is conditional upon Shareholder approval (which is being sought pursuant to Resolution 4).

If Resolution 4 is passed, then the Company will be able to proceed with the issue of JLM Options to the JLMs (or their nominee(s)) at any time during the period of 3 months after the Meeting (or a longer period, if allowed by ASX), without using up any part of the Company's Placement Capacity under ASX Listing Rule 7.1.

If Resolution 4 is not passed, the Company will not be able to proceed with the issue of the JLM Options and will need to agree alternative form of compensation to the JLMs, for example, cash payments based on an independent option valuation.

5.4 Directors' recommendation

The Directors recommend that Shareholders vote in favour of Resolution 4.

5.5 Technical information required by ASX Listing Rule 7.3

- (e) the JLM Options will be issued for nominal cash consideration of \$0.000001 each, raising a total of \$63 which will be applied towards working capital;
- (f) the purpose of the issue of the JLM Options is as part of the compensation payable to the JLMs for the services provided under the JLM Mandate;
- (g) the JLM Options are being issued pursuant to the JLM Mandate. The material terms of the JLM Mandate are summarised at Section 1; and
- (h) a voting exclusion statement is included in the Notice for Resolution 4

Each Option entitles the holder to subscribe for one Share upon exercise of the Option.

(b) **Exercise price**

Subject to paragraph (i), the amount payable upon exercise of each Option will be \$0.008 (**Exercise Price**).

(c) **Expiry Date**

Each Option will expire at 5:00 pm (WST) on 31 December 2028 (**Expiry Date**). An Option not exercised before the Expiry Date will automatically lapse on the Expiry Date.

(d) **Exercise Period**

The Options are exercisable at any time on and from the date of issue until the Expiry Date (**Exercise Period**).

(e) **Notice of Exercise**

The Options may be exercised during the Exercise Period by notice in writing to the Company in the manner specified on the Options certificate (**Notice of Exercise**) and payment of the Exercise Price for each Option being exercised in Australian currency by electronic funds transfer or other means of payment acceptable to the Company.

(f) **Exercise Date**

A Notice of Exercise is only effective on and from the later of the date of receipt of the Notice of Exercise and the date of receipt of the payment of the Exercise Price for each Option being exercised in cleared funds (**Exercise Date**).

(h) **Shares issued on exercise**

Shares issued on exercise of the Options rank equally with the then issued Shares of the Company.

(i) **Reconstruction of capital**

If at any time the issued capital of the Company is reconstructed, all rights of a holder are to be changed in a manner consistent with the Corporations Act and the Listing Rules at the time of the reconstruction.

(j) **Participation in new issues**

There are no participation rights or entitlements inherent in the Options and holders will not be entitled to participate in new issues of capital offered to Shareholders during the currency of the Options without exercising the Options.
